1. Read the following passage carefully and asnwer the questions that follow: The roles friends play in our lives has become significantly greater than at any other time in our history. Today many of us live and work at great distances from where we were born or grew up and are separated from our original families. The pain we feel when we are away from our families can be significant.

The happiness of the individual relies on friendships which form a necessary human connection. It is perfectly normal to need and want friends and depression is more prevalent among those who lack friends. They lack the intimacy and richness which friends can bring into our lives. Frequently friends reflect similar values to us. Yet these values are often different from the ones we grew up with; they are the values we created for ourselves in our adult lives. Sometimes a friendship can bring out the positive side that you never show in any other relationship. This may be because the pressure of playing a 'role' is removed. With a friend you are to be yourself and free to change. Of course you are free to do this in all other relationships as well but in friendships you get to have lots of rehearsals of discussion about changes as you experience where you receive as much as you give. You can explain yourself to a friend openly without the fear of hurting a family member. How do friendships grow? The answer is simple.

Like watering a plant, we grow our friendships (and all our relationships) by nurturing them. Friendship need the same attention as other relationship if they are to continue. These relationships can be delightfully non-judgmental supportive, understanding and fun. By revealing yourself; being attentive; remembering what is more important to your friends and asking them about it; putting yourself in their position; showing empathy, seeing the world through the eyes of your friends, you will understand the value of friendship. All this means learning to accept a person from a completely different to your own or perhaps someone from a completely different cultural background. This is the way we learn tolerance. In turn we gain tolerance and acceptance for our own differences.

Friendships offer a great opportunity to learn about yourself because a friend can reflect back to you 'how you come across the world'. They also allow you to practice skills in dealing with 'personal boundaries' by looking after yourself as well as your friends. They help you develop resilience in relation to the wider social world beyond your family.

There are two problems that cause great worry to our educationists - the problem of religious and moral destruction in the land of many faiths and problems arising out of the large variety of languages. Taking up the education of the children we see that they should be trained to live one another, to be kind and helpful to all; to be tender to the lower animals and to observe and think right. The task of teaching them how to read and write and to count and to calculate is important but it should not make us lose sight of the primary aim of molding personality in the right way. For this, it is necessary to call into aid culture, tradition and religion.
